WHAT IS TITLE I?

Title I is a federally-funded program designed to provide help for students in the areas of reading and mathematics.

Title I programs are located in the seven elementary schools with the district's highest percentage of children eligible for free and reduced-price lunch, and the two Catholic schools in the district. Within these schools, students needing assistance to meet grade-level standards receive this help regardless of their participation in the federal lunch program.
